Title: When Habakkuk Cooks a Stew (Part 1)

Text: **Habakkuk 2:2-4**Date: **July 17, 2022** 

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## Big Idea

How does one get right with God? There is no question more significant in all the word. And there is no text in the Old Testament that brings us closer to an answer than Hab. 2:4.

Tucked within the latter half of this verse is the answer to our pressing question. These words tell us how we get right with God. They tell us how we can hinge from meriting his wrath to enjoying his favor. They tell us how we can get life from him and with him—not just momentarily, but eternally.

That's why the authors of the New Testament grab hold of this statement and quote it on three separate occasions as they attempt to expound for us the gospel and what it means to be saved and reconciled to God (Rom. 1:17; Gal. 3:11; Heb. 10:38).

### 1. Habakkuk 2:4

There's a way of being *righteous* before God, of *living*, of escaping judgement, and it's, in one way or another, by *faith*. So we've got to know what this is!

"Righteous"—This word could be referring to those who are ethically, morally, personally, practically righteous. But it could also be referring to those who are righteous by way of God's decree—they've been declared as such, counted as such in the courtroom of heaven, even if, perhaps there are some spots on their record so far as their earthly lives are concerned.

"Live"—This word could be referring to a person's way of life. But it could also be referring to the reward of life that God will grant those who are righteous by faith.

"Faith"—This word could be referring to a life of faithfulness to God, waiting obediently for him. But it could also be referring to the mere act of placing one's faith in God—a fundamental transaction in

humility, where we come and put the full weight of our hope on him, trusting him to do what only he can.

It seems to me, in all of this, it really comes down to two basic options: On the one hand, we could take this as there's this initial act of faith whereby we place our trust in God and, in that he counts us as righteous, not because we perfectly uphold the law, but because we trust him to save and intercede on our behalf. We're like Abraham. We've got nothing. We trust him to do it. He counts our faith as righteousness. And we live!

But on the other hand, we could take this to mean that, in some way or another, if we want to escape God's coming judgment, if we want to be right with him, we have to walk with him, we have to endure to the end, we have to be faithful. We can't bail out on our obedience. We don't just get to make a decision once and then go on our own way. We're not just saved by faith, we need to walk faithfully day by day.

So which is it? In Christ . . . it's both!

#### 2. Romans 1:17



  2:4 in each instance? What do you think they are trying to
  say? What new perspective does each citation give you on
  these same words from the prophet?
- Which part of the "stew" that Habakkuk is cooking up in this verse did you most need to hear this morning (justification by grace through faith or sanctification by the same)? Why? How would such a truth change your upcoming week?
