Title: A Peace without End

Text: Isaiah 9:2-7

Date: December 4, 2022

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Big Idea

What is peace? And where do we find it? The biblical notion of peace (shalom) is so much more magnificent and comprehensive than we tend to think of it. And the amazing thing: it's given to us freely by grace through Christ!

1. What Is It?

It seems to me that, in our culture at least, when we think of peace, we tend to reduce it down and locate it in one dimension of life or another.

Dimension #1: Emotional/Psychological

Dimension #2: Social/Relational

Dimension #3: Natural/Physical

In the Bible the word for "peace" in the Greek of the New Testament is $eir\bar{e}n\bar{e}$; and in the Hebrew of the Old Testament it's a word you may well know: shalom. What we find when we come to consider these words, shalom in particular, is that the biblical notion of peace is vastly more comprehensive and magnificent then we typically think of it. As I said, we might locate our sense of it to one dimension or another, or perhaps some combination of them, but we inevitably fall short of the majestic sweep this word is given in the Scriptures. It encompasses everything!

This peace that the Bible speaks of is not just a warm, fuzzy feeling or a friendly embrace, or a spot on the beach, or something like this. No, it goes far beyond this! Shalom is the realization of the deepest longing of every human heart for a better world, for a world as it should be –complete, whole, perfect . . . in every dimension!

2. Where Do We Find It?

Our pursuit of peace largely follows right in line with our understanding of it back from the first question. So it should come as no surprise, then, that we tend to try to find it wherever it was we first thought to locate it.

Approach #1: Emotional/Psychological

Approach #2: Social/Relational

Approach #3: Natural/Physical

Here is where we start to connect the dots from Christmas to Easter, from Bethlehem to Calvary, from the manger to the cross. So as he's coming into Jerusalem, he pauses to weep over the city: "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes" (Luke 19:42). You see, in the book of Isaiah, the Prince of Peace from ch. 9 is also the Man of Sorrows from ch. 53. How is he going to bring peace to us? By laying his life down for us. You know what's happening at the cross, right? It's the complete undoing of shalom for Jesus. It's everything you and I deserve being dished out to him. In every dimension, it's just falling apart. He's taking the full weight of God's curse against our sin. Why? "[U]pon him was the chastisement that brought us peace . . . (v. 5). To bring us peace, shalom. That's why.

3. How Does It Change Us?

When we find peace with God in Jesus, it changes us. But how? We become agents of peace ourselves. In particular, we *preach* it and we *make* it.
